- A total of 36 students transferred from CVCS to other schools during the summer. Twenty- two (22) students transferred to other Socorro district schools. These numbers do not include 8th graders who graduated from CVCS .
- A total of 25 students transferred to CVCS from other schools during the summer. Fourteen (14) of these students transferred from the district schools. These numbers do not include entering kindergarteners.

**Special Education:** We continue to advertise for a certified special education teacher. In the meantime, our program is running well with Rebecca Madrid, Candy Lindquist, and Lilia Requejo providing academic services. Janet Brook provides speech and language services for 16 students. Positive Outcomes will begin next week to provide Occupational and Physical Therapy services to 6 students.

**Interscholastic Athletics:** Five CVCS students are participating on Socorro District Teams. No decision has been made yet about monetary compensation to the district by the charter school for this participation. The district has estimated that it costs about \$600 per student athlete at the high school and about \$400 per student athlete at the middle school.
